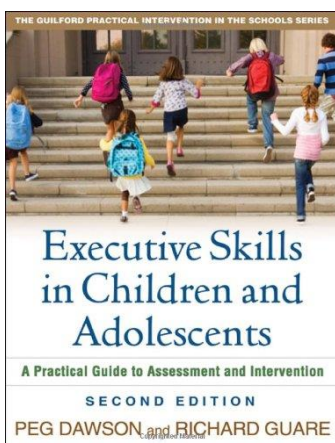


Classroom teachers, coordinators of gifted and talented services, school psychologists, school counselors, and administrators
